

2013 Reappraisal Process Begins

Michael E. Kovack, Medina County Auditor, announced today that Medina County has started work on the state-mandated 2013 Sexennial Reappraisal process.

Auditor Kovack said, “The Medina County Auditor’s Office is required by law to collect and update information on every parcel of property in the county. To comply with this I have developed a staff of individuals called ‘data collectors’ whose sole responsibility is to collect and update information on a continuous basis for both commercial and residential properties. These data collectors have begun the review of the county.”

It is important for the general public to know that all the data collectors in the Auditor’s Office must wear identification badges and clothing clearly marked “Medina County Auditor’s Office”. Vehicles are also marked. Before collecting information about a property, the data collector will knock on the front door of a property. No data collector will enter anyone’s home unless an appointment has been made. Two data collectors will always be present on an interior inspection.

Data collection will begin in the western townships of Medina County and work eastward.
